## **WILLIAM NOONAN APPOINTED TO HEAD U.S. SECRET SERVICE DALLAS FIELD OFFICE**

(Dallas, TX) - United States Secret Service Director Joseph P. Clancy has announced the appointment of a veteran agent with a distinguished record to the position of Special Agent in Charge in Dallas.

William Noonan, a veteran agent with over 23 years of experience in the agency, recently took over as the Special Agent in Charge (SAIC) of the Dallas Field Office. He has executive oversight and is responsible for all Secret Service Activities in the North Texas District.

“Throughout his career, Bill has developed the reputation for being a leader of great character and is well respected within the Secret Service and the greater law enforcement community,” said Clancy.

SAIC Noonan began his career with the Secret Service in 1993 conducting criminal investigations in the mid-west. In the early years of his career, he served in highly challenging positions including the Vice Presidential Protective Division and the U.S. Secret Service training facility.

SAIC Noonan ascended the management ranks serving as the Assistant to the Special Agent in Charge in Charge of the New York Field Office, where he supervised financial crimes investigations. He later transferred to Criminal Investigative Division at the Secret Service headquarters, where supported and coordinated complex investigations, which were conducted in different regions of the country. His successes in managing and creating agency policy for the emergence of cyber-crimes/computer network intrusions earned him several promotions in the Cyber Investigation Branch. In his position as the Deputy Special Agent in Charge, Noonan had oversight over the agency’s entire cyber mission portfolio to include, the Cyber Intelligence Section, the Critical Systems Protection Program, Electronic Crimes Task Forces, the National Cyber Forensics Institute, as well as partnerships with U.S. Computer Emergency Readiness Team and the National Cyber Investigative Joint Task Force. His expertise required that he routinely testify before subcommittees and full committees, in the U.S. Congress.

“The appointment of proven leaders, like William Noonan, ensures that the Secret Service will continue to successfully accomplish our critical integrated mission of protection and investigations.” said Kenneth Jenkins, Assistant Director, Office of Investigations.
